# Does homework improve student achievement?

# Depends on whom you ask!

For as long as teachers have been assigning homework, students have been complaining about it. It can also be a divisive issue for parents – some support more homework, while others advocate for less.

An article in the March 2013 issue of *District Administration* magazine provides an excellent overview:

A U.S. survey found that time spent on homework has risen 51 per cent from 1981 to 2003. The greatest increase is among elementary students.

A review of research found a positive relationship between the amount of homework high school students do and higher academic achievement. However, among elementary students, there was no relationship between time spent on homework and academic achievement.

In countries with high homework demands, students perform worse on international TIMSS (math and science) testing than students with less homework.

In 2012, Finland and South Korea ranked numbers one and two on the *Global Index of Cognitive Skills and Educational Attainment*, based on international test scores, literacy and graduation rates. Yet these two countries have very different approaches to education, with Finland offering shorter school days and little homework, while South Korea has longer school days and rote learning.

# **Parent Census Results**

The Toronto District School Board recently released the results of its 2012 Parent Census. The survey results contain both good and bad news. Among the findings:

- 93% of parents felt welcome in their schools, up from 87% in 2008
- 83% of parents go to parent-teacher interviews, up from 72% in 2008
- 49% of families have income of \$50,000 or less
- Only 47% of parents attend school meetings and events, but that is up from 38% in 2008
- 90% of higher-income families participate in activities outside of school, while only 38% of lower income families participate in programs

# **Reducing childhood obesity**

North American children are at risk of being the first generation to have a shorter life expectancy than their parents, in large part because they weigh more and they get less exercise.

Last year, Ontario's Ministry of Health and Long Term Care appointed the Ontario Healthy Kids Panel to make recommendations about how to reduce childhood obesity by 20%. In its report, the panel recommended working in three main areas: pre-natal care, changing food "environments," and building healthy communities, including substantial changes to health policies and practices in schools

The government has announced that the Ministries of Health and Long Term Care, and Children and Youth Services will work together to develop a plan for implementing the panel's recommendations.
