Principal's Message

As parent teacher interviews are upon us, we encourage you to take this opportunity to find out about your children's progress. Report cards will be sent home on **Mon. Nov. 12**. Below are some questions and tips that you may find useful. Interpreters are available. Please contact your children's teacher or indicate your requirements on the parent-teacher interview form.

Great Questions to Ask

- What skills does my child need to work on?
- What activities can we do at home to strengthen those skills?
- Does my child complete his/her work and assignments efficiently and conscientiously?
- Is my child facing any struggles in class not related to her/his schoolwork?

Interview Tips

- Talk to your children about school before the interview. Ask how they think they are doing and how the teacher can help them meet their goals.
- Get an idea of what the curriculum is like, the level your children are working at, and areas where they are struggling.
- Make a list of what you want to know before the interview. Knowing what you want to know and writing it down ensures that you don't forget anything, and that you get the information you need.
- **Be open and honest.** Feel free to add your own observations around your children's behaviour, strengths and weaknesses.
- Find out what they're learning. Ask what your children have learned and what is coming up. Know the skills your children will need to be successful in the term ahead (i.e. knowing how to multiply and divide fractions).
- **Ask about** strengths and weaknesses. Find out about problems before they happen. This information will

allow students to get help before they fall behind.

- Find out how often and how much homework is being assigned as it relates to the TDSB's Homework Policy. Also ask if your children are completing their homework regularly, how long the work assigned should take to complete and does the teacher check the homework regularly and provide feedback. The answers to these questions will help you better monitor your children's work habits.
- Ask what you can do at home to help your children. Make a commitment to support your children's learning.

I hope you have a successful interview and Ms. Adams and I will be available for consultation on the evening of Nov. 15 and the morning of Nov. 16 during interview times. We are also available to sit in on interviews if necessary. Please contact the school if you have any questions.

Lincoln Alexander remembered

Lincoln Alexander was a former Wilkinson Student and, later on in his life, a respected member of parliament and a great leader. He was the first Black member of Parliament in Canada, representing Hamilton West in Ontario for four successive elections from 1968 to 1980. In 1985, Governor General Jeanne Sauvé appointed Alexander the 24th Lieutenant Governor of Ontario. He became the first black person to serve in a vice-regal position in Canada and is a member of the Order of Ontario and a Companion of the Order of Canada.

Alexander was born Jan. 21, 1922, in Toronto, Ont., to his parents Mae Rose and Lincoln Alexander, Sr. He lived most of his life in Hamilton, where a highway, the Lincoln Alexander Parkway, was named after him. He often joked about this, since he never held a driver's licence.

While Alexander was working for the Progressive Conservative party, he was said by his fellow members of Parliament to be the only one with no enemies. He was always open to new people and new suggestions.

Alexander married Yvonne Harrison in 1948 when he was 26 years old. They were married for 51 years. She died of Alzheimer's in 1999 at age 88. Alexander remarried Marni Beal in the summer of 2011. "No way could an old codger like me attract someone as lovely and intelligent as Marni, but she fell for my bologna," he once said.

Sadly, Alexander and Marni were only together for about a year before his death, which fell on the night of Oct. 19, 2012.

We are saddened by the end of Lincoln Alexander's life, and appreciate all that we have learned from him. – By Julia Lapena, Genya Kleiner and Claudia Kindrachuk, Grade 6
