Principal's Message

Welcome back to a new school year!

Safety is a primary responsibility and concern here at Wilkinson. We will be forming our Safe Schools Committee by the end of September, which will complete a school-wide safety audit by the end of October. The committee will be comprised of parents, chief caretaker, teachers and administration. Please look for regular Safe School updates in the Newsletter.

Allergy Awareness – Did you know?

We feel that all parents would like to be aware that there are children in our school with severe life-threatening food allergies. This condition is called anaphylaxis (ana-fill-axis). This is a medical condition that causes a severe reaction to specific foods or other materials, and can result in death within minutes. Although peanuts and peanut products are the most common foods to cause anaphylaxis, shellfish, fish, eggs, sulphites, milk, sesame seeds, soy or any other food can cause this dangerous condition. In recent years, anaphylaxis has increased dramatically among students. Although this may or may not affect your child's class directly, we want to inform you so that you may choose to send foods to school with your child that are free from potential allergens.

Our school has a specific Anaphylaxis Action Plan and the Board has procedures for the prevention and management of anaphylactic reactions. Staff is trained each year in-house, and from Anaphylaxis Canada who also can provide presentations to students. Although we cannot be a completely nut or allergen free school, we are considered a very "allergy aware school." If your child has health problems of any kind, please inform your child's teacher or office staff immediately so that the necessary health protection steps may be taken. If your child has been prescribed an Epi-Pen, we encourage you to train them to carry it on their person and to obtain a medic-alert bracelet for them to wear.

Thank you for your understanding and co-operation in this important matter. If you have any questions or concerns, please drop by the school office and we will be happy to address them.

JUNIOR CHOIR (Ms. Levy)

- Semester 2: First rehearsal will be on Wed., Jan. 15.

Library News

Hope your summer was full of good reading! All classes have begun (or will start very soon) regular **book exchanges** and you may have seen library books coming home with your child. Books borrowed from the library are self-selected by your child. I will provide them with suggestions and guidance and steer them toward age-appropriate reading material. Reading with your child and providing her/him with a quiet time and space for reading are ways that you can help to instill a love of reading and foster reading confidence.

Library Day

Grades 4-6 students may take out as many as 4 books, Grades 2-3 students as many as 2 books, and Kindergarten and Grade 1 students may take out 1 book. Kindergarten students have a book bag with their name, classroom number and library day on it. It is important that all books are returned (or renewed) each time the class visits the library. Ask your children which day of the cycle their library day is and help them to return their books on time. "Library Day" may be noted on some classroom calendars. There are no overdue fines but students will not be able to take out any more books until outstanding books are returned.

Scholastic Book Fair

The first **Scholastic Book Fair** is set to take place from Nov. 11-15. This falls on the same week as Parent Teacher interviews so be sure to pop into Room 3, say hello and do a little bit of book shopping! As usual, I will be putting a call out for parent volunteers. In case you wondered what the Community Council does with the money we fund raise, here's a list of our many accomplishments from the past school year:

Extra Curricular Activities (ECA): filling a gap in services

• The absence of extra curricular activities in the 2012-2013 school year had council members step up to the plate and organize some of their own ECAs.

• Starting late January 2013, a series of ECAs were held on Friday evenings, allowing kids of all ages and abilities to come out and try their hand at Dodge Ball, Ball Hockey, Badminton, Volleyball, Basketball, and other fun games.

Wil-Kitchen: connecting parents through cooking

• Through a TDSB Parents Reaching Out Grant, Council hosted three sessions on Health Eating run by Lisa Shamai, a caterer in our community who's interest is in the relationship between the food we eat and our health.

• Wil-Kitchen also hosts a Fun Fair prep night.

• Wil-Kitchen has been an important part of our parent outreach as it brings together a mix of new and seasoned Wilkie parents of diverse backgrounds and abilities to connect and learn from each other.

Fun Fair: Wilkinson's day to give back to the kids

• This is the Council's biggest fundraiser and community event of the year.

• The event promotes Wilkinson in the community and enables Council to provide services and programming to the students and fulfil funding requests from the staff.

Movie Nights: flicks for fun and fundraising

• Council held seven movie nights this year three before Christmas, four after).

Sweetheart Sale: controlled chaos for one's sweetheart

• Council held its annual Sweetheart Bake Sale in February. This is a much anticipated event for the kids.

Pumpkinfest: *enjoying the fall and our community*

• A community event held in the fall that includes selling pumpkins and other items. Though this event brings in some funds from the sale of pumpkins, the focus is to bring the community together and to enjoy the fall weather.

• Free coffee, apple cider and baked goodies shows that community activities don't always have to be about raising funds.

Pizza Lunches: how excited the kids are on those Fridays

• The last Friday of the month has come to be known as Pizza Day.

• A fundraiser that gives the opportunity for the students to have lunch with their friends.

Communications: keeping parents informed

• Council prepares monthly newsletters and issues special notices of events to keep parents informed and engaged in what is happening at the school, and with education at the TDSB and provincial level.

• We maintain a Website that we strive to keep current with upcoming activities, school and council information, forms and links to other resources.

Arts: developing appreciation through painting and performances

• This year the Grades 1 to 6 had two performances and the AM and PM Kindergartens had one each – all paid for by Council.

• The performances in 2012-2013 included Native Dancers, Brazilian Dancers, Kim and Jerry Brody who are folk singers, and a puppet play.

• Bringing the arts into the school ensures an opportunity is given to all students to develop an appreciation of artistic expression in various forms.

• An eco-focused, community effort to keep our schoolyard green and relevant.

• Part of the Council's ongoing support of the Learning Garden Revitalization.

Curriculum Night & Council Elections – Sept. 26

Curriculum Night is **Thursday Sept. 26 from 6-7p.m**. This is an opportunity to meet your child's teacher, see the classroom, and learn about grade expectations and the class routines. Before the classroom activities start, Mr. Kelly will introduce the teachers in the gym at 6p.m. and then the School Community Council elections will take place. The election only lasts a few minutes and then parents head off to the classrooms for the remainder of the evening.

Curriculum Night is an informative evening to learn more about your children's education and what they do each day at school. If you require specific information about your child's progress, please make arrangements with the teacher to meet privately. Curriculum Night is not intended for parents to discuss their child's progress.

Lateness Reminder

In order to provide the best possible program for students, it is necessary for them to attend school regularly and on time. When students are late they miss important information and it is disruptive to the teacher's lesson.

Late Slips – Safe Arrival!

Teachers take attendance twice a day – first thing in the morning and right after lunch. For those students who don't arrive before the national anthem in the morning or before 12:35pm after lunch, they must go to the office and get a late slip before going to their classroom. This lets the office know that a child is safe at school, even if a teacher has already marked them absent. Problems arise when a child doesn't get a late slip because there is no record that he/she is at school. We want to avoid unnecessary concern and panic of parents being called and told their child is not at school when they are! If your child isn't going to be at school, call the *Absence Line* (416-393-9575; press "1").
