EARLY LEARNING PROGRAM (ELP) UPDATE

On January 12th Premier McGuinty released the approved list of the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) sites to offer the Early Learning Program (ELP) in September 2010. You may have also heard this referred to as full-day kindergarten.

Since then, there has been a lot of media coverage on full-day kindergarten programs being implemented over the next six years.

The first 15% of schools to offer full-day kindergarten have been published in newspapers and online. Wilkinson has not been included in that group. The only school in our area to offer the program next year will be Pape Avenue.

The fact that we are not directly involved in the pilot process will give us an opportunity to follow the Ministry and the TDSB throughout the year to see how the implementation will take place.

This should make for an easier transition when Wilkinson is included on the list to offer the program.

On Registration Day, remember to bring all of the following information about your child:

• Age (a birth certificate, a baptismal record or passport)

• **Address** (two pieces of identification that show your address, such as your telephone bill, driver's licence, etc.)

• **Immunization** (the card that shows a list of needles your child has received)

• **Citizenship** (a Canadian birth certificate, a Canadian passport, a Permanent Resident Card or TDSB School Admission Letter, etc)

ERADICATING HEAD LICE AT WILKINSON

In order to try and eliminate head lice from our student population, we have a screening committee made up of a public health nurse, Vice Principal Leasa Adams and trained volunteers. Once a term, the committee checks every student's head for lice and nits. If it appears that a student has an infestation, the parent/guardian will be called and a letter will be sent home. Children will not be informed in the classroom in order to maintain confidentiality.





In accordance with TDSB procedures, the parent/guardian will be required to make arrangements for treatment and to keep the child home until the problem is cleared. A Treatment Instruction Sheet will be provided. Our next screening will take place early in February.
