On Wednesday, June 8th, Wilkinson had our very first EcoSchools Audit. Mme Barbier met with the EcoSchools auditor to discuss the many environmental initiatives that have been taking place this year. The auditor was impressed with the leadership of the Eco Team in encouraging classrooms to turn off their lights and engage in proper recycling practices. She was also impressed with the Council's work on the native learning garden. Teachers were praised for their incorporation of ecological literacy into their teaching.

Next year, the Eco Committee is planning on expanding the litter less lunch program by rewarding litter less lunches throughout the year. We will continue to monitor classroom lights and garbage, and will begin to monitor classroom floors to reduce the number of classroom materials that are swept up by caretakers each day. It has been a very busy year at Wilkinson! The Wilkinson School Community Council is an active group who are dedicated to enriching the academic lives of Wilkinson students and ensuring that parents are informed. I'd like to thank all of the members of this year's Council and other parent volunteers who contribute their time and energy to enhance the Wilkinson experience for the students and the community. I'd also like to take this opportunity to highlight some of what we've been able to accomplish this year through their efforts and commitment:

1. Parent outreach and community building through events like our Wil-Kitchen cooking evenings, garden clean-up party, badminton game nights as well as our movie nights and Pumpkinfest which also double as fundraisers.

2. Support of Wilkinson's focus on literacy and the arts by providing funding for the school with visiting authors and performances for all grades.

3. Keeping Wilkinson green and promoting environmental awareness through our ongoing Native Learning Garden Revitalization and Veggie Garden.

4. Keeping parents informed through regular newsletters, the Council bulletin board and our web site in addition to welcoming new parents at kindergarten registration.

The Council meets monthly to provide input to the principal and staff on issues that affect our children. Some parents stay on the Council for a few years but each year members move on and we would like to ensure that the Council remains vibrant and representative of our school population.
