On February 17th, grade 3 classes took a trip to Valley Park Middle School to participate in *Literacy Live!* It was a reading and writing festival where well known Canadian children's authors spoke, sang, drew and read to their primary student audience. Authors included Ruth Ohi, Ted Staunton, Sharon Jennings, Eric Walters and Jeremy Tankard. The students I have spoken with were thrilled with the event. Thanks to all of the parent volunteers and, of course, to the grade 3 teachers for agreeing to take their classes.

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Principal's Message

It's hard to believe March Break is right around the corner. We have had a very successful and busy year here at Wilkinson thus far. I would like to take this opportunity to thank our Community Council who continue to work on your behalf to make Wilkinson a great place to go to school, from Movie Nights and WilKitchen to arts presentations and supporting field trips, our Council is busy supporting your school year round.

I would also like to clarify an issue that has had some parents, and students, concerned over the past few weeks. We have been focusing on persuasive writing in both primary and junior divisions. To get students passionate about writing and taking sides on an issue, some staff members have provided a scenario to write about. Often times the scenario involves something very important to our students such as recess, music or physical education. Don't be alarmed if your child has informed you that we are losing or cutting back on any of the above. Instead, rest assured that we are not and please encourage them to write persuasively about why it is important to them to keep them.

Finally, we are busy looking for ways to make Wilkinson an even safer place for students. One of the concerns raised by staff is adults on the second and third floors. We ask that students be dropped off and picked up on the first floor. Parents are further asked to drop things off at the Main Office and not to go to classrooms while classes are in session. If you must go to the second or third floor please check in at the Main Office for a Visitor's Pass. Let's work together to keep students safe inside and outside our building.
