#### SWIMMING AT EARL GREY'S POOL (TUESDAYS FROM 4-5PM)

Earl Grey Sr. Public School's pool will offer an open recreational swim every Tuesday from 4:00-5:00pm. Kids 12 or older may come alone. Children under twelve must be accompanied by a responsible adult (16+). The upcoming dates are: May 4th, 11th, 18th, 25th, along with June 1st, 8th.

The cost per swim is \$5 OR if you bring a friend the two of you can swim for \$6 - we call this the 'Bring a Loonie for a Loonie' special! Accompanying adults are free.

Access to the change rooms is from 3:45 to 5:15pm. There are no lockers, just cubbies so leave your valuables at home. There will be two lifequards on duty and someone at the door to receive your swim fee. Enter Earl Grey (100 Strathcona Ave.) using the west-facing doors which open into the parking lot on the west side of the school. Head straight downstairs and you're there!
