Principal's Message

As the school year winds down, it is a busy time for everyone here at Wilkinson. We have a number of athletic events starting including Track and Field, Grade 3 and 6 EQAO testing, final report cards, graduations and Fun Fair. Please look for information coming home on these over the next little while.

This year one of the things we have focused on is preparing our students to be good ambassadors, to help each other out, to give to people who are less fortunate and to help out by fundraising for people who have experienced natural disasters. I am very impressed with the way the staff, students and families here at Wilkinson have embraced and supported these initiatives. Thank you for contributing to these endeavours and instilling these values in your children. I would also like to acknowledge the work of Ms. Adams in co-ordinating these activities throughout the school year.

Finally, our Spring Concert was a huge success and we collected almost \$1300.00 at the door. This money will go towards the purchase of new instruments. Thank you for your donations!

Facilities Update:

Our Safe and Caring Schools committee began a number of projects this year and have been successful in making Wilkinson a safe and caring school. These projects include the installation of new lighting inside and outside the building, new safety vests for supervision in the school yard and a new classroom hall pass system.

In the coming weeks we will be replacing the cameras in the front foyer and adding additional cameras in the basement and the schoolyard. There will also be a new digital recorder installed inside the office. This equipment is purchased and sanctioned by the TDSB Safe and Caring Schools department.

There will be grading work taking place in the school yard this Spring to allow for better drainage and to prevent the pooling of water. Our goal is to get rid of those small ponds that form in the yard after it rains.

We are constantly looking for ways of improving and upgrading the facilities here at Wilkinson. Your thoughts and ideas are always welcome. Your Parent Council is working hard on the Early Learning center in the Kindie area, the native plants Learning Area and the new Vegetable Garden.

Curriculum Update:

We have had continuous training throughout the year. The focus has been on Critical pathways, Descriptive Feedback and Success Criteria and our most recent training session on April 27th had Debbie Kasman from the Ministry focusing on Guided Reading. During the month of June we will be busy planning for the next year.
