

Vice Principal's Message

Creating a Safe and Caring School

At Wilkinson Junior Public School, we strive to provide a safe and nurturing environment where all students are free to learn, grow and pursue their personal best. During the past couple of weeks I have been visiting classrooms to talk with the students about bullying prevention.

Through discussions, books, films, and drama activities we have explored the following questions: What is bullying? What are the differences between tattling and getting help? What are some of the strategies we can use when confronted by a bully? What is the role of the "onlooker"?

Parents can also be a big help. Here are some suggestions on what you can do:

- Model appropriate ways of getting along with others: e.g. showing empathy for others, managing angry feelings, accepting differences, and coping with peer pressure.
- Monitor your child's television viewing. Discourage TV programs that model anti-social behaviour.
- Help your child find ways to express anger that do not involve verbally or physically hurting others. When you get angry, use it as an opportunity to model these appropriate responses for your child and talk about it.

The staff and I will continue to address any problem of bullying throughout the year, and with your help, we can make Wilkinson a Bully Free Zone!

Report Cards



You may have heard reports in the media recently that report card language is set to be overhauled, in particular the comments that are included regarding the student's progress or capabilities. A memo leaked to the Toronto Star says that the Ontario Ministry of Education will reassess the language used in report cards to make it more personal, clear, precise and meaningful. They may also provide translations for parents who don't understand English.

The ministry document argues that report cards are currently written in a way that simply mimics curriculum guidelines, but offers little insight to parents about what their kids are learning or how well they are doing. Many parents have voiced the same concerns.

"Parents find them absolutely filled with jargon and gobbledygook that don't seem to have any relation to their own child," Annie Kidder, executive director of People for Education, told the Star.

The Ministry review is scheduled to start next year. We will keep you posted as we find out more about any changes!
