### **Auditions for Claude Watson School for the Arts**

Each year the Claude Watson School for the Arts (130 Doris Avenue in the Yonge and Sheppard area) holds auditions for admission to the school. There are 60 spots available in the Grade 4 year. The school is also holding auditions for possible vacancies in Grades 5-8.

The screening process for students is a series of studio experiences in dance, drama, visual arts and music. Auditions take place at the school, located near Yonge St. and Sheppard Ave., and are conducted by a team of adjudicators, both professional artists and teachers. The auditions will be conducted on Saturdays during the months of February and March.

The school will hold two information evenings on Tuesday Oct. 22, 2013 and Wednesday, Oct. 23, 2013 at 6:30 p.m. School parking is limited so families should leave sufficient time to find street parking. These meetings will review the school's program, the application process and provide parents with an opportunity to ask questions.

This year there is an on-line application process that will be available Monday Oct. 21, 2013. To apply on-line, parents are asked to visit www.claudewatson.org under "Admissions." The deadline for applications is December 31, 2013.

## **Recent EQAO Results: Math scores are down**

People for Education says recent EQAO results show that students have improved in reading and writing but math scores have declined.

The organization says that while test scores do not provide the complete picture of how our education system is doing, they can help teachers, schools and policy-makers determine what is working well and where there are problems.

This year's results show continued increases in the percentage of students reaching the provincial standard (approximately "B") in reading and writing, but they show continued declines in math for students in Grades 3 and 6.

The change in math results raises a number of questions, says People for Education, including:

- Over the last five years, has there been a change in students' attitude towards math?
- Are certain groups of students struggling more than others?
- Does teaching experience affect the scores?
- Have the tests changed?
