PALS is up and running at Wilkinson!

"There's always room for one more" -- that's the motto for P.A.L.S. -- a playground leadership program offered by Toronto Public Health in collaboration with the TDSB. The objectives of the PALS (Playground Activity Leaders in Schools) program are to:

- · increase physical activity
- · decrease conflict and reduce the incidence of playground bullying
- · provide leadership opportunity for students

Over 48 enthusiastic grade 4 and 5 students filled out applications for a PALS position -they were asked how they were good helpers, and why they thought PALS would be good for Wilkinson. After careful consideration of their applications, and teacher recommendations, 23 PALS were chosen. They then spent a half-day training on leadership and games with a Toronto Public Health nurse.

Beginning May 20th our great group of leaders were out on the playground during recess. teaching great ball, tag and skipping games to any interested primary grade students. Each PALS leader has one or two scheduled days a week on the playground, and so far they seem to be a having a great time sharing their new found knowledge of classic games!

parent council report

Highlights from the 2007-2008 School Year This year was another busy and productive year for the Council and the committees. We are fortunate to have such a dedicated group of parents who join and consistently come out to the meetings.

Financials

Our opening bank balance in Sept. 2007 was approx. \$15,580. This year we raised just over \$14,000 with expenditures totaling just over \$17,300. Therefore, we will be starting the next school year with approx. \$12,280 in the bank.

Our main fundraisers this year were Pizza Lunches, Movie Nights and the Fun Fair. While overall we did well financially with our fundraising efforts, chocolate sales were not as profitable this year. We will be looking at some other alternatives for fundraising for next year. The major items that the Council provided funding for this year are:

Arts Committee

We arranged for at least 2 performances for each grade - all within our budget of \$2,500. Next year we are looking to bring in more visual arts to the programming.

Communications

We combined the principal's newsletter with the council's so that the school could present a consolidated message for parents. This also reduces the amount of paper going home which is "greener" and lowers our costs. We also made several enhancements to the Web site. This year we gathered input and created an outline for the Parent Manual. Next year we'll put it together and distribute it.

Greening & Grounds

A pine grove funded by TD Friends of the Environment was planted in the primary play area. We continue to gain support from teachers and parents for outdoor classroom/learning garden and Eco Schools Program. We have plans to rejuvenate the primary play area and to plant 8 new trees in the yard.

Health & Safety

This year focused on ways to make the school and school grounds safer (e.g. access pads installed on all the doors). Next year we'll continue to work with staff to promote and support bullying prevention and intervention at Wilkinson.

Our Community Cooking Evenings

This year we had two Wil-Kitchens - One in the fall where a Wilkinson parent led us through the art of making samosas and the second one at the end of May where we made some of the dishes for our Fun Fair food booth. These are relaxed, hands-on, informal evenings to cook, eat and chat. There is interest in continuing these cooking evenings so we will look into having more next year.
