Song-writing Workshop

On January 25th, Wilkinson's grade 6 students participated in a song-writing workshop with top Canadian artists, Melanie Doane and Ted Dykstra, who are also Wilkinson parents. Melanie started off by performing a few songs for the students, talking a bit about lyrics and why she likes to write music.

The students then wrote down their own song title ideas and the group randomly chose one to work on as a class. Lyrics were suggested to construct the verses which were quickly brought to life by Ted and Melanie doing the music and singing out the lines the students had written. The choruses were created from the initial title and before too long they had most of the tune mapped out.

The workshop was met with rave reviews:
