## faq

### **Frequently Asked Question**

**Q:** What is EQAO testing?

A: On May 25th Wilkinson students in grades 3 and 6 will commence the province-wide EQAO testing, including students in French Immersion (the tests will be in English). All public school students in Ontario must write these tests. EQAO stands for Education, Quality and Accountability Office. This office was established to certify that our public schools are meeting the reading, writing and mathematics expectations of the Ontario Curriculum.

What if my child is sick on testing day?

EQAO testing is mandatory for all public school students however exemptions can be granted under special circumstances. Parents need to speak to the school principal if, for any reason, they feel their child cannot write the tests. If a child is away on an EQAO test day, the principal will make arrangements for the child to make up the test but all testing must be completed within the second test week.

### When do parents see the results?

The tests are marked during the summer and results returned in the fall. Results are reported for school boards and each school. Every child tested will receive an Individual Student Report that assists parents in determining if their child needs extra help to learn and to meet the curriculum expectations. The EQAO tests are NOT part of a child's report card and do not reflect all of their abilities.
