MEETING RECAP

The 2006/07 Wilkinson School Community Council held its first meeting of the school year on Oct. 10th.

Council approved the following funding requests: Child care for monthly Council meetings, final payment for the storage shed (\$2,000), five performances for the students (up to \$3,500) and printing costs for the Council's newsletter.

Updates were provided from the following committees:

- Greening & Grounds (TDSB is looking at moving the shed so people can't climb on it)
- Communications (always looking for contributions to the newsletter; Karin Deane and Ms. Ault looking after Council bulletin board in the main hallway)
- Fundraising (update on chocolate sales, recipe books, direct donations, movie nights, pizza lunches)

Other items:

Council was advised that many parents have voiced their appreciation for the removal of the basketball nets over the summer. A concern was expressed regarding over-crowding at the entry doors. Staff are looking into it and trying to resolve the issue and fixing the traffic jam that is particularly bad at the south doors.

FAQ



Q: What happens at Council Meetings?

A. The Wilkinson School Community Council meets monthly to provide input to the principal and staff on issues that affect our children. Anyone from the Wilkinson School community is welcome to attend council meetings. This year we have 12 parents who have volunteered their time to participate, in addition to the principal, vice principal and a teacher representative to make up the council.

Council meetings follow an agenda, distributed to members in advance of the meeting. Anyone – council member or other interested party - can put an item by contacting the council chair. Typically meetings open with a Principal's Update. During the update we learn about upcoming events at the school and any board-wide initiatives that affect our children. Next is the Treasurer's Report. The treasurer distributes a statement of our financial position, provides an overview of the council's finances and takes any questions members may have.

Committee updates typically follow the treasurer's report. Each committee coordinator provides a brief overview of any activities undertaken over the past month by the committee, and shares plans for future work. Should a committee require the approval of council for an action item or expenditure, the coordinator puts forward a motion for discussion and voting. These updates provide council members with a sense of what's happening at the committee level, without the need to dedicate a lot of time at council meetings to discussing all the details of those activities.

Meeting discussions and votes are recorded, and minutes are distributed following each meeting. You

may view minutes of previous meetings on the Wilkinson Web site at www.wilkinsonschool.ca.

Council meetings are held the first or second Monday of every month (see the calendar in the newsletter for dates), from 7:00 to 8:30 pm in the Staff Room on the 2nd floor. Childcare is available.
