attention. If your child needs dental follow-up, you will receive a letter explaining what needs to be done. If you can't afford dental care, your child can get free care. It's important to have your child's teeth checked by a dental professional every 6 to 12 months.

Lice Check - October 23

On Thursday October 23rd, the school will be screening all students and staff for lice. If a live louse or multiple nits are found in your child's hair, you will be asked to take your child home immediately for treatment. That is simply to prevent the lice from getting onto another child's head. If only a couple of nits are found in your child's hair, you will be informed by letter that day and asked to remove the nits at home that night. If an affected child is in your child's class, you will be informed by letter that day. Since Ms. Watt started holding regular lice checks at Wilkinson in 2006, the number of cases has gone down dramatically -- from 7 or 8 cases per class, down to about 5 cases in the entire school!

Lice can spread from person to person when hair or headgear come into contact. It's impossible to avoid all such contact, but there are a few simple precautions we can all take. Remind your children to never share hats, helmets, combs, brushes, hair ribbons or headscarves. If lice are found on you or your child, after removing nits and lice from your hair, remember to vacuum all surfaces that may have come in contact with your head, and wash all clothes and linen that may have been exposed.

The Toronto Board considers lice a nuisance rather than a health risk. But most parents agree it's better to get rid of them before they spread to other kids or parents. Experts disagree on the best way to do this. Some people choose to use chemical treatments, and pharmacists can give advice on which ones seem to work best. But all chemical treatments carry potential health risks. Some people swear by traditional oil and vinegar or mayonnaise treatments, while others do routine checking and combing with special lice combs, such as the LiceMeister. 

fundraising

Every year parents help enrich students' experience and learning environment at Wilkinson by contributing both their efforts and financial support.
